



# Safety information


Please read the safety instructions carefully before using the product for the first time and keep the instructions for future reference.


- 1. This product is not a toy. Keep it out of reach of children.

- 3. Product operating and storage temperature is from 0 degree Celsius to 40 degree Celsius.


Under and over this temperature might affect the function.

- 11. Do not use non original accessories together with the product as this can make the product functionality abnormal.



**POWER SUPPLY** - Connect the power cord to DC IN on the device. Connect the power adapter to a suitable household power outlet. Press the "**POWER**" button to turn the appliance On or Standby. Press the "**SOURCE**" button to enter DAB, FM, Bluetooth, CD or USB mode

**VOLUME** - Adjust the volume level with the "**VOLUME**" control.

**SETTING THE CLOCK** - Date and Time is automatically set once the unit receives DAB radio broadcast signals (and when such info is available).
